Stephen Houghton CHILDS (jnr)

5th child of Stephen H. CHILDS & Ann COPPIN

Born 29 May 1868 at Little Hampton.

Harriett CLEGGETT

Her parents George Robert CLEGGETT and Harriet SIMPER of Langhorne's Creek

Born 22 May 1868 at Langhorne Creek

Hannah POWELL

Her parents Edward Henry POWELL and Hannah CLEGGETT

Born 12 March 1873 at Langhorne Creek

Stephen H. CHILDS (24yrs) married Harriett CLEGGETT on 21 Dec 1892 at Blakiston.

Their first child Clarice Jean CHILDS (called Jean) was born 9 Oct 1893 at Littlehampton.

In 1895, 3 years after his marriage to Harriet, Stephen and his brother James established the Childs Brothers brickyards on 5 & 1/2 acres the eastern side of Childs Road, Little Hampton. I haven't been able to verify it, but it is likely that they learn their trade by working either in the COPPIN brickyard at Little Hampton run by their cousin James, or the L.T. WATTS brickyard at Little Hampton run by L.T. WATTS at Little Hampton, whose sister, Louisa Lucretia WATTS had married James COPPIN.

Harriet died 6 March 1898 (30yrs) 1 week after childbirth of their 2nd child Heartie

Heartie died 7weeks later.

Stephen married Hannah POWELL 15 September 1902 at Strathalbyn.

Hannah POWELL and Harriett CLEGGETT were cousins.

On 13 October 1902, Steven withdrew from the brickyard business. Edwin (Ted) Miels joined James in the business, and it traded as Childs & Miels until 5 Mar 1917, when Ted Miels withdrew from the business due to ill health.

Hannah died 25 February 1904 at Langhorne Creek.

Stephen H. Childs charged a Hahndorf man with assaulting him at Hahndorf, on 11th November 1905

Stephen H. Childs was granted the Licence for The Windmill Hotel, Main North Road, Prospect on 14 March 1906. He was charged with liquor supply breaches on 18 April 1906 but pleaded not guilty. He transferred the licence to Charles Allen on 15 September 1906.

In October 1906, when his father passed away, Stephen was living in Littlehampton. In February 1914, Stephen was living in Littlehampton. He sued C. J. Boswarve of Rose Park for commission due on the sale of a brickyard

On 4 September 1925, Stephen Houghton Childs (aged 56) was knocked down while crossing King William Street near the Gresham Hotel at 10.30 pm. He sustained a broken leg and an injured right shoulder. His address was listed as 1 Clifton Parade, Unley (possibly 1 Clifton Street Millswood or 1 Clifton Street Malvern).

Stephen died 9 July 1944 (St James Anglican Church Cemetery, Blakiston)
