

ANDREWVILLE

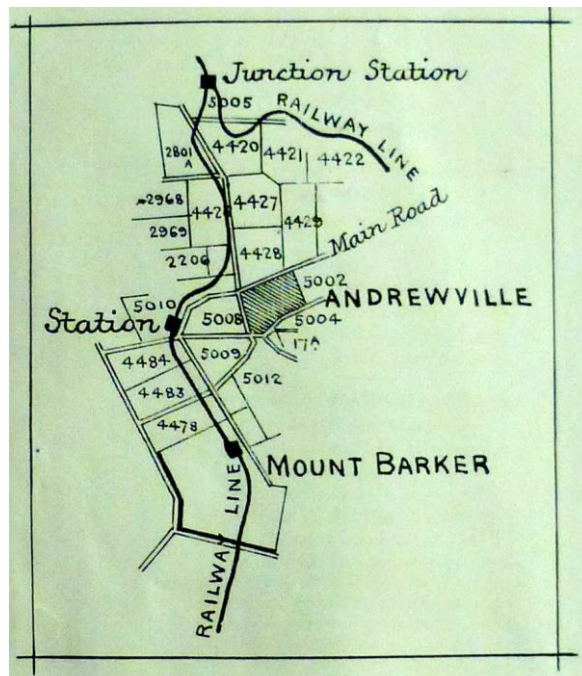

Heading through Littlehampton in the direction of Nairne, Littlehampton ended where the roundabout is now, near the Great Eastern Hotel. After the roundabout, starting from West Terrace, the houses on the right were the township of Andrewville.

The land involved was originally owned by Justice Andrews and was described as around 75 acres and comprising sections 5000 and 5001 in the hundred of Macclesfield. Mr. Jesse Wigzell (a Little Hampton storekeeper) purchased 75 acres from Justice Andrews and 20 acres from Mr. J. J. Bonnar. About 10 years later, he sold it to an Adelaide syndicate, which subdivided it and named it Andrewville after Justice Andrew. This land extended from the Great Eastern Hotel up to the Blakiston Glebe land with a frontage to the main road and back roads to Mount Barker and Nairne. I haven't researched the exact dates of the survey and the subsequent land sales, but a newspaper report indicated that the town had been surveyed some years before the allotments were finally offered for sale in October 1882.
